Background to the Catch - Up Premium Plan

The recovery premium is additional funding awarded to schools to help support pupils following the pandemic. The provision for our Recovery Premium is monitored for impact through our standards committee. The recovery premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by pandemic; the grant will be available be available for the 2020-2021 & 2021-2022 academic year. Though funding has been calculated on a per place basis, school should use the sum available to them as a single total from which to prioritise support for pupils according to their need. The government allows us to use this money in the best way for our cohorts and circumstances making sure that it impacts on children in terms of improving their English and Maths skills and supports their social and emotional well-being.
