Subject in the Spotlight - Science

I am thrilled to bring you the latest updates on our exciting Science curriculum for this half term. Our school is buzzing with engaging learning experiences, and I can't wait to share the highlights with you. Let's now take a look at what the children have learnt so far:

EYFS Update:

This half term, our Reception and Nursery classes have embarked on a meaningful journey of discovery. 

The PTA are looking for donations of wool. If you have any lying around your house that you no longer need or are able to purchase some to donate we would be very grateful.



Free School Meals

There are 2 types of Free School Meals

1. Statutory Free School Meals

If you already receive housing benefit or council tax support, or have recently applied, you don't have to do anything.

If you don't receive housing benefit or council tax support, you need to apply for free school meals.

2. Universal Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 your child will already be receiving Universal Free School Meals, however, it is still very important that you complete the Free School Meals application as having this eligibility entitles you to receive help with other school provisions such as some school trips or clubs etc...
