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Free School Meals

There are 2 types of Free School Meals

1. Statutory Free School Meals

If you already receive housing benefit or council tax support, or have recently applied, you don't have to do anything.

If you don't receive housing benefit or council tax support, you need to apply for free school meals.

2. Universal Free School Meals

If your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 your child will already be receiving Universal Free School Meals, however, it is still very important that you complete the Free School Meals application (if you are eligible to claim) as having this eligibility entitles you to receive help with other school provisions such as some school trips or clubs etc...

Black History Month 2023

This October, we have carried out a whole school project to mark Black History Month 2023. This year, the theme has been 'Saluting Our Sisters' with all classes finding out about significant women and their contributions to science, politics and sport. We shared our findings with each other by coming together in the hall to showcase our work. The children created timelines, leaflets, artwork and mindmaps about a range of women from Harriet Tubman and Rosa Parks to Lauren James and Nicola Adams. Our understanding then developed even further through our weekly Big Question work. During class discussions, we explored why Black History is an important subject to our school.









Subject in the Spotlight - PE - Mrs Handley

Excellent progress has been made in developing the children's 'Agility, Balance and Coordination' during outdoor PE lessons.

The focus in Key Stage 1 has been on development of fundamental movement skills including, jumping, skipping, side-stepping. The children have also enjoyed using the ladders and hurdles. These skills will be transferred to all areas of PE throughout the year.

In gymnastics, the children have been using equipment in PE to practise sequences including jumps and rolls.

In Lower Key Stage 2, the children have also been making super progress with their ABC's and Gymnastic skills. Lots of collaboration taking place during group work and resilience shown this term.

In Upper Key Stage 2, the children have continued to develop their Agility, Balance and Coordination skills. While applying these to team games, developing their knowledge of Dodgeball and Netball. During gymnastics, they have been mastering their vaults and jumps.

Personal Development update - Starlings

Starlings class has had a great start to the academic year. They have developed a respectful manner towards all members of the class and the classroom environment. Last week, on a visit to the Lowry Art Gallery, the staff complimented the children on their enthusiasm and standard of behaviour.

Working well with their partners and in their groups, Starlings children have shown excellent collaboration skills. Their greatest achievements have been in the progress made in their handwriting which continues to improve every day and in their addition and subtraction skills.

















Subject in the Spotlight – Science – Mr Simpson

I am thrilled to bring you the latest updates on our exciting Science curriculum for this half term. Our school is buzzing with engaging learning experiences, and I can't wait to share the highlights with you. Let's now take a look at what the children have learnt in the past fortnight:

EYFS Update:

Within our vibrant Reception Class, our little explorers have taken great delight in unravelling the mysteries of the human skeleton while expanding their vocabulary. Engaging in a range of captivating activities cantered around this skeletal theme, they've enthusiastically embraced the learning process. From labelling skeletons to playfully tracing one another's outlines, they've also marvelled at the symmetrical aspects of their own bodies. This immersive experience has not only deepened their understanding but has ignited their curiosity about the intricate framework that supports our bodies.

Key Stage 1 (KS1) Update:

Throughout this half term, our young learners in Key Stage 1 (KS1) have been enthusiastically immersing themselves in the wonders of the natural world. Just this week, they embarked on an exciting sensory journey, exploring the realms of taste. They've playfully engaged their taste buds, experimenting with a delightful array of flavours, including sweet, sour, salty, and bitter. Among these, the consensus on the taste of lemon seems to be unanimous: "Yuk!"

Lower Key Stage 2 (LKS2) Update:

In the past week, our Lower Key Stage 2 (LKS2) students have delved into an eye-opening exploration of sugar in our diets and its potential. negative effects. They've taken a closer look at their own eating habits, meticulously tracking and graphing the amount of sugar they consume using both tally charts and bar graphs.
