UKS2 Curriculum Newsletter



Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely break over Summer - it has been wonderful to welcome the children into their new classes. They have settled in well and shown great enthusiasm towards their lessons. Please see below for the outline of what the children will be learning this half term:

History: Hunter Gatherers

In this unit, we will be learning all about prehistoric Britain, long before the Roman invasion in 43AD. We will begin by travelling through the Stone Age, learning about how the first humans came to set foot on British soil and how they adapted to battle through the Ice Age. We will then journey through the Bronze Age, and further on to the Iron Age, and look at how key advancements helped change their lifestyles at a rapid rate.



Art:

The children will begin their collage unit by looking at the work of Andy Burgess and how he creates cityscape art pieces using a variety of materials and vibrant colours. They will continue to develop their drawing skills by looking single point perspective drawings. This will then be developed into creating their own cityscape collage inspired by Andy Burgess' art work.



Science:

This half term, we will be learning about Animals including Humans. In this unit, children explore key milestones in baby and child development. They understand that babies are completely dependent on an adult to survive and will cry to communicate if they are hungry, uncomfortable, too hot or too cold. Children learn that both the mass and length of a baby changes drastically within their first year after birth. Children work scientifically by reading and interpreting data about the length and mass of babies. They will also plot a line graph to show how the length of a baby changes in their first months after birth.

PE:

During outdoor PE the children will begin the new school year by working on the fundamental movement skills of 'Agility, Balance & Coordination' These will then be applied throughout the year. During the indoor lesson, they will be working on developing their Gymnastics knowledge.

PE days:

Doves: Tuesday and Thursday
Kingfishers: Wednesday and Thursday
Eagles: Mondays and Fridays
Falcons: Tuesday and Thursday

RE: Christianity

Within this unit, pupils will learn about what Christians believe God is like, exploring key texts from the Bible.

They will study passages to work out some ways the Bible says that God is both holy and loving. Pupils will link their learning in this topic to other concepts studied to suggest why Christians believe this. By the end of the unit, they will be able to explain that for most Christians, getting to know God is like getting to know a person.



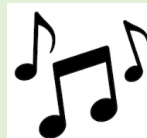
PSHE:

This half term, **Year 5** pupils will learn about positive relationships, role models and communities. They will explore respect, personal boundaries and self-worth, while also developing the skills to recognise and respond to peer pressure and make positive choices. Our **Year 6** pupils will develop respectful communication through debates and discussions, explore different types of relationships, learn about marriage and the law, study British Values, and understand how to stay safe on the roads. They will build their skills in respect, critical thinking and personal safety.

Computing: Digital Citizenship will allow children to think about how they affect and are affected by the online world. They will consider online safety, their online footprint and the importance of acting with "netiquette".

Music:

The children will learn to read staff notation for 1, 2 and 4 beat rhythms. They will learn about African drumming; playing with the correct posture and gain an understanding of 'the beat', 'rhythm' and 'tempo'.



Please ensure your child is always fully prepared for the school day with their school bag, reading record & reading book, homework, and anything else they may have been asked to bring in.



Please can all children bring in an old shirt or t shirt (the bigger the better) that they can wear to protect their uniform during messy activities and Art.

Home Learning:

- Reading 10-15 minutes 5 times per week and completion of reading records
- Completion of spelling activity in homework book. (15mins)
- Completion of arithmetic activity in homework book. (15mins)
- Completion of English activity in homework book. (15mins)
