Why is reading important?

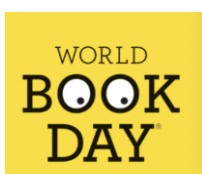
The importance of reading for children cannot be underestimated. A child's education, social and cognitive growth, general well-being, and mental health can all be enhanced by reading for enjoyment.

Research shows that by reading to children, you provide them with a deep understanding about their world and fill their brains with background knowledge. They then use this acquired background knowledge to make sense of what they see, hear, and read, which aids their cognitive development.

Reading gives us the ability to travel outside of our own reality. We can learn about a culture completely different from our own while immersing ourselves in the lives of imaginary people within the pages of a book. Additionally, we can experience a variety of emotions, pick up new words and phrases.

On **Thursday 6th March** we will be celebrating World Book Day. This year we have decided to host a story time day. This means that children can come to school wearing pyjamas these can be character related but it is not compulsory. We ask that children bring a book to swap with their friends.

Our reading buddies have helped stock this and have chosen some new and amazing books on their visit to Waterstones.

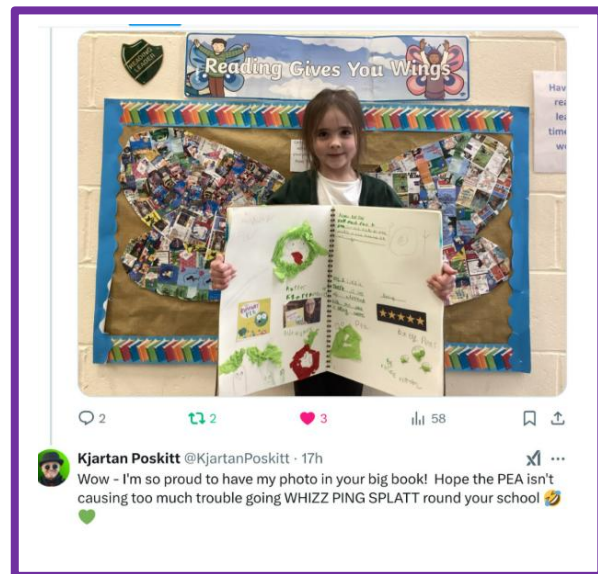


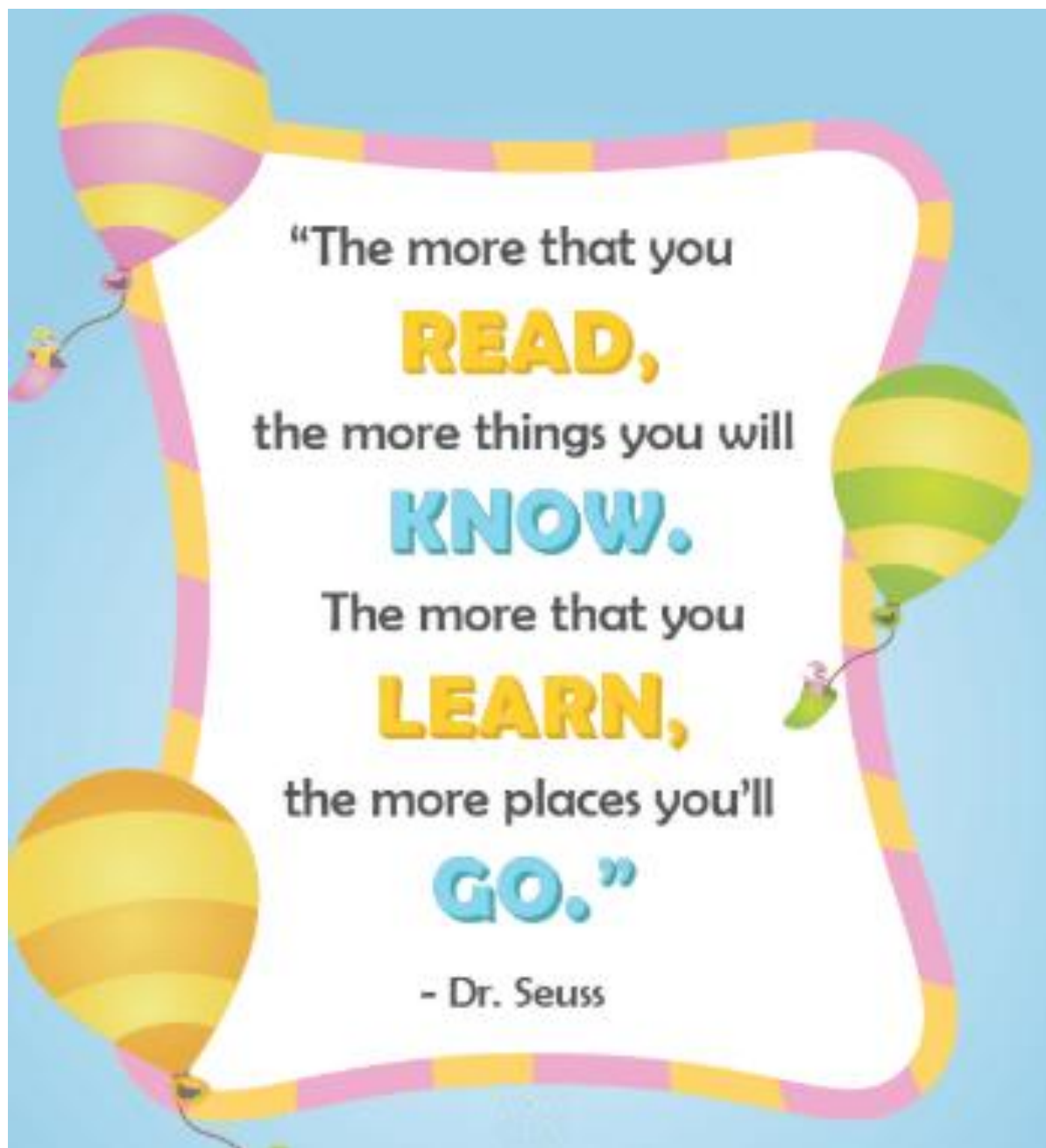
February Half Term Reading Challenge 17th – 21st
