

### Sport Premium Grant Background

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The purpose of the funding is that schools will have to spend the sport funding in improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Accountability Schools will be held to account for how they spend the sport funding. At The Gates Primary School, we have been allocated £18,470.00 for the financial year 2024-2025. As a school we intend on using the money to develop children's and teacher's skills within the P.E curriculum.
