Year 6: 70% of children achieved all 3 assessment points

Year 6 have been provided with swimming lessons at a local leisure centre. As well as contributing towards their fitness, the high quality swimming lessons have taught all children, when able to, to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres using a range of strokes effectively.

When children are ready, specialist-swimming instructors have taught the necessary knowledge and skills needed to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations to our children.
