History: The Great War



In History, we will be looking at how Britain was impacted by World War One, particularly our town of Westhoughton. We will learn where WW1 falls in the timeline of British history and the sequences of events within this; the cause and


outbreak of WW1; the countries who were involved in WW1; recognising why trenches were dug and how it impacted the life of all those involved.

Science: Material Properties

This half term's science unit is really exciting. To start the unit, children will be taking part in an 'escape the room' challenge with activities based on their prior learning. Children will carry out a series of tests and investigations throughout the half term with the aim of furthering their understand as to why certain materials are more suitable than others for particular purposes.

PE: Dodge ball and Dancelinked to our History topic of World War One.

On the days when your child has PE, they should attend school in their PE kit for the entire day, in accordance with our Covid-19 risk assessment. RE: Why do some people believe in God and some people not?

In this unit we will be looking at the reasons why people choose to

believe/disbelieve in God and explore what religion means to people. Children will explore the unique relationship between religion and science and investigate whether it is possible to follow both. We will discuss the impact that religion has on the lives of their followers.

DT: Structures - Trenches

In DT, we will be creating our own model WW1 trenches. We will practise using tools such as hand drills, bradawls and glue guns before creating our own design. Children will measure, cut and join resources together before decorating and adding specific features of the trench.

PSHCE:

Our overarching topic for PSHE this half term is Relationships. Children will be learning about



seeking and giving permission in different situations, recognising pressure from others and learning where to receive advice and report concerns. At the end of the unit, children will be given the opportunity to discuss and debate topical issues, learning to respectfully agree and disagree.

Computing:

This half term the children will be developing their Digital Literacy skills. . They will be using Power Point to present information researched about World War 1. Then they will learn how to use Excel to present data in spreadsheets, use simple formulas and to create graphs.




French:

This half term, the children will learn new vocabulary related to families in French. They will learn the nouns for different family members and key questions before describing their family to each other.
