### Curriculum Night...

We will be creating a Curriculum video to share with you this term. This will be an opportunity for staff to further explain what children will be doing in school, how children are taught, strategies to help at home and we will share the end of year expectations. After this video you will then receive your child's reading book and diary. In the mean time you can help support your child at home by sharing books at home, talk about their day, counting, colouring in, playing with playdough etc.

Class Names	Snack Money
As you may have noticed every class in school has a bird name. We are the Penguin Class! Staff in the Penguin class are: Mrs Jarrett, Mrs Lenagan, Mrs Parnell, Mrs Higginbottom, Mrs Mort and Mrs Blundell.	We request a voluntary contribution of £1 week for snack in EYFS. Snack money should be put in a named envelope each week. There is also an option to pay termly. If paying termly, the amount will change due to the different number of weeks in each term.
Physical Development We provide opportunities for children to develop both their gross motor and fine motor skills every day through both our indoor and outdoor classrooms. Part of the curriculum focuses on dressing and undressing independently; this is something you can help with at home. Children will not require a P.E kit until later in the year.	<b>Independence</b> A big part of Early Years is to foster children's independence. This can be putting their own coats on, going to the toilet independently, and taking their shoes on and off, washing their hands and using a knife and fork at lunch. We focus on lots of these areas in school and support children in becoming independent. We also ask that these are things you work on with your child at home on a day to day basis.

Please ensure your child brings a coat and school bag each day. Also can you please make sure that **everything** is labelled with your child's name...even shoes!
